Red dot report

We couldn't have hoped for a better start to 2023, with January being one the most successful months on record for the stable! With 15 individual winners, 3 winners at Stakes level and a further 20 placings, we finished the month with a winning strike rate of 6.2 and a top 3 strike rate of 2.6!

The Wellington Cup Carnival proved a happy hunting ground for us. We recorded 5 winners across the two days, including the Group 3 IRT Wakefield Stakes with Codigo and the Group 3 NZB Desert Gold Stakes with Mazzalino. The victory of 2YO Codigo in the Waikato Stud colours gave us great pleasure, given we trained his sire Ardrossan who now stands at the famous Waikato nursery. He is raced in partnership by Dame Lowell Goddard and Waikato Stud who are both great supporters of our stable and the NZ Racing & Breeding industry.

Our crop of 3YO's continue to develop very nicely toward their feature Derby and Oaks targets. Listed Salver winner Cruz Missile and Andalus look nice Derby prospects, while our group of fillies look to have us well placed as we head towards the NZ Oaks.

The NZB National Yearling Sale returned to its usual slot in January, and we were thrilled to add 11 outstanding yearlings to our stable. We place a huge amount of emphasis on having quality stock in our team for the years to come and our investment surpassed that of any other year. Codigo heads early Marsh treble



Marsh commenced with wins by Mercurial and Laneway Flirting and believed he had a great chance to make it three in a row with the son of Ardrossan, after the showy bay had won narrowly but impressively on debut at Matamata earlier in the month.

NZ Racing Desk writes:

Trainer Stephen Marsh made the early stages of the 2023 Trentham summer carnival all his own as he capped an opening treble with exciting two-year-old Codigo taking out the Listed IRT Wellesley Stakes (1100m).

Rider Michael McNab had Codigo quickly away from his inside barrier before taking up a trailing position behind the Mark Walker-trained pair of Sky On Fire and Rubicon Crossing.

Keen to get off the fence early in the run home, McNab angled his mount across heels and quickly joined issue with the leading pair before settling down to a dogfight with Rubicon Crossing where he prevailed by a neck at the winning post.

Marsh had been confident of a good performance having long believed his charge has enormous potential. "It is a bit special for this horse, being by Ardrossan, who we trained and to get three on a day is special for sure," Marsh said.

"He is a lovely horse, who was unbeaten at the trials and then won his first start.



""We probably ran him today a little bit sooner than we would have liked to, but this was a perfect race for him. "Michael gave him the right run, although I think he might need a week in the paddock now as he might just be feeling his shins.

"He has ticked off the black-type win and ultimately we will aim him for the Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (Gr.1, 1400m)."

McNab was keen to secure the mount on Codigo after his first win at the trials and the pair have been inseparable ever since.

"When I got back from a Covid break and holiday, Dad said that Stephen had a real nice Ardrossan colt," he said.

"I managed to get on him for his next trial then his first raceday start and today he has won very well.

Raced by his breeder, Dame Lowell Goddard along with Waikato Stud, Codigo becomes the first stakes winner for his sire Ardrossan who was retired to stand at Waikato Stud in 2019 after a racetrack career that saw him win four of his nine starts including twice at stakes level while also finishing third in the Gr.1 BCD Group Sprint (1400m) at Te Rapa.

Zee Falls finds winning groove in Karaka Cup



After coming so close in countless feature races, talented staying mare Zee Falls (NZ) (Sacred Falls) had a deserved moment in the spotlight when scoring a convincing victory in the Collinson Forex Karaka Cup (2200m) at Pukekohe on Saturday.

NZ Racing Desk writes:

Prepared by Stephen Marsh, the five-year-old daughter of Sacred Falls has now recorded three wins, four seconds and five thirds from her 26 starts, and will be aimed at some black-type options as the broodmare paddock beckons.

Zee Falls was a black-type winner early in her three-year-old season, taking out the Gr.3 Wellington Stakes (1600m) at Otaki in just her fourth career start.

But she was forced to play supporting roles through the rest of her three and four-year-old campaigns, finishing eighth in the Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m), second in the Gr.2 Waikato Guineas (2000m), fourth in the Gr.2 Lowland Stakes (2100m), sixth in the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m), second in the Gr.3 Manawatu Cup (2250m), third in the Gr.3 City of Auckland Cup (2400m) and third in the Listed Anzac Mile (1550m).



Until Saturday's breakthrough, her five-year-old season had brought more of the same – fourth in the Listed Staphanos Classic (1950m), second in the Listed Feilding Gold Cup (2100m), fourth in the Gr.3 Counties Cup (2100m), sixth in the Gr.3 Waikato Cup (2400m) and a last-start third in the Gr.3 Queen Elizabeth II Cup (2400m). But Saturday was finally her day. Slotted into a beautiful midfield position by world-class visiting Australian jockey Damian Lane, Zee Falls was doing everything with ease as she cruised into striking position approaching the home turn.

Lane went for gold in the straight and Zee Falls responded, charging past the front-running Sagunto and opening up a clear lead. She began to tire in the last 150m, but held all challengers at bay and scored by three-quarters of a length from Contemplation with race favourite Tutukaka finishing third.

""It was a brilliant result. She's been running such good races in all of those big Cups, and we just thought this would be a beautiful race for her. It was awesome to have a world-class rider like Damian Lane aboard, and he rode her perfectly," Marsh said.

"I'm thrilled for the owners. She's a lovely mare, and she'll make a lovely broodmare in time. She might end up being sold a bit later in the year for her breeding career, but a race like the Travis Stakes (Gr.2, 2000m) for fillies and mares at Te Rapa might be a nice one to aim at before that happens."
